### **Burglar Kendall McKinney Convicted**

*Tamuning, Guam*-Kendall Norris McKinney was convicted today by a Guam Superior Court Jury who found him guilty of burglary as a second degree felony, theft of property as a third degree felony as a lesser charge and one count of theft by receiving as a second degree felony.

In July of this year, McKinney entered a home known to him and stole a television and laptop. Approximately a month later, he returned to the same home and stole a Chevy Trailblazer which was found stripped at the Okkudo Pipeline about two weeks later.

Nineteen witnesses took the stand during this trial, some of who saw McKinney driving the Trailblazer and attempting to sell its rims. The laptop and television were never recovered.

“There were many obstacles in this case; but the jury was able to see that this man was responsible for these crimes and for the betrayal he inflicted on his victims, who once took him in and cared for him. I’d like to thank the victims for their courage and support and I’d also like to thank the jury for serving their civic duty,” said Assistant Attorney General Christine Tenorio.

“Ultimately, we only seek to keep the streets of Guam safe. This defendant will not victimize other residents of our community,” said Assistant Attorney General Gabrielle Rossi.

McKinney faces up to 25 years imprisonment and will be sentenced in February by Judge Anita Sukola.
