OAG Opposes Court's Sentencing

Hagatna, Guam- Today, Earvin Rivamonte Enriquez was sentenced for committing one count of first degree criminal sexual conduct as a first degree felony and one count of second degree criminal sexual conduct as a first degree felony for molesting his 9 year-old victim back in April of 2011.

The first degree criminal sexual conduct charge is punishable by a mandatory minimum imprisonment of fifteen years and a maximum of life imprisonment without parole.

Enriquez, who was convicted in September of last year, was sentenced to the statutory mandatory minimum of fifteen years imprisonment for the first degree criminal sexual conduct charge, but the court suspended 5 years of it, the result being that Enriquez will serve only 10 years in jail.

The Office of the Attorney General believes this is an illegal sentence and fully intends to review the courts written decision, and if necessary, file a motion for reconsideration or an appeal to the Supreme Court.
