Camacho Convicted for Stealing from Former Girlfriend

June 4, 2014- Tamuning, Guam- After just forty-five minutes of deliberation, a Superior Court Jury convicted Brian Keith Camacho of theft of property as a misdemeanor after he stole numerous items from his former girlfriend's home last March.

The victim told police that she suspected her former boyfriend was taking items she had purchased prior to their relationship and selling them without her permission. Camacho told police that because he was in a relationship with her at the time, he assumed the items he took were community property.

"I am happy to have secured a guilty verdict in favor of the People of Guam, in particular for the victim of this theft and all victims of theft. This is one less thief we have to worry about running around our streets," said assistant attorney general Nicole Driscoll.

The evidence for proving the total value of the items stolen reduced the charges from a second degree felony to a misdemeanor.

Camacho faces up to one year imprisoned at the Department of Corrections. His sentencing hearing is set for July 10, 2014.

Camacho has another pending case in which he is charged with burglary as a second degree felony and theft as a third degree felony.
