Quichocho Convicted of Burglary

April 29, 2014- Tamuning, Guam- Ricky O. Quichocho Jr. was convicted today after a Superior Court Jury found him guilty of two counts of burglary, theft as a second degree felony, and theft as a misdemeanor as a lesser-included offense of theft- all as a second degree felonies.

Quichocho faces up to 16 years imprisoned at the Department of Corrections for his involvement in the burglary of two establishments last May, one where \$4,000 worth of property was taken, and in another where \$13,000 was stolen.

Later that same month, Quichocho was pulled over for speeding by Guam Police Officers and was arrested after he admitted the \$3,642 discovered in a backpack was his and that he had obtained it from the burglaries.

“This verdict marks another victory for the people of Guam in the fight against theft. One by one, victims are standing up and fighting back against those who would seek to steal their hard-earned valuables. We are indebted to the victims and humbled by their courage in testifying,” said Assistant Attorney General Gabrielle Rossi, who prosecuted the case.

Quichocho’s sentencing hearing is scheduled for August 29, 2014 at 2pm.
