#### **Campos Jr. to Spend 46 years in Jail**

*March 11, 2014- Tamuning, Guam-* Anthony Leon Guerrero Campos, Jr., the man who robbed a female employee of a convenience store in Maite and three female employees in Sinajana just days apart, was sentenced today in Judge Benson's Courtroom to 46 years incarceration at the Department of Corrections.

Assistant Attorneys General (AAG) Gerald Henderson Jesse Nasis and prosecuted the case in December and a Superior Court Jury subsequently convicted Campos of four counts of second degree robbery as a second degree felony. Each count carried a special allegation for the possession and use of a deadly weapon in the commission of a felony.

In early October last year, Campos walked into a mini mart in Maite armed with a silver handgun. He pointed the handgun in the face of the cashier and demand that she open the cash register. He then fired a gunshot into the counter inches from the cashier and repeated his demand. The victim's hands shook so violently from fear; it took her a few attempts to open the register, whereupon Campos reached in, grabbed the money, and fled the scene.

Surveillance footage of the incident was released to the public and three members of the community came forward to positively identify Campos, one of whom was a family member.

Just days later, he robbed three employees of Sinajana Payless in the parking lot as they were leaving work for the night. Campos and two unidentified men, fired shots in the air prior to demanding the employees' purses. All three victims were able to identify Campos during a photo lineup.

Campos had previously been convicted and served two years for a robbery and armed assault committed on Saipan.

"I would like to thank the witnesses. They did not hesitate to assist the police and testify against Campos. Thanks to them, Campos will never be able to victimize another person. They stopped Campos from committing any more robberies and they very well may have saved someone else's life." Said Assistant Attorney General Gerald L. Henderson

"Again, the teamwork exhibited by the prosecution division ensures the safety of the People of Guam."
