Q Mart Burglar Convicted

March 25, 2014- Tamuning, Guam-Repeat offender Albert Torres Tedtaotao was convicted today by a Superior Court Jury of burglary as second degree felony and theft of property as a third degree felony. He faces anywhere from 5-15 year imprisoned at the Department of Corrections.

In December 2012, Tedtaotao burglarized Q Mart in Hagatna where he reportedly stole approximately \$4,000 worth of cigarettes and \$200 cash. The storeowner, who arrived at around 4:30am, observed damage to the store's entrance and saw a male individual exiting the area. Guam Police reviewed the surveillance footage provided by the storeowner and showed it to Tedtaotao's parole officer, who confirmed it was Tedtaotao ransacking the store.

"The guilty verdict in this case would not have been possible without the courage of the Victim and the hard work of the officers at the Guam Police Department. This conviction will prevent others in our community from being victimized by this repeat offender," said Assistant Attorney General Jesse Nasis.

Tedtaotao will be sentenced in late April before Judge Anita Sukola.
