Game Room Burglar Convicted

August 07, 2014- Tamuning, Guam- Another burglar has been successfully convicted by a Superior Court Jury after the prosecution team of the Office of the Attorney presented facts and evidence against Jason Jesus Cruz.

Cruz, who was convicted of burglary as a second degree felony, faces anywhere from 5-10 years incarcerated at the Department of Corrections. He is repeat offender.

During the early morning hours of March 18, 2014, Cruz entered a game room in Mongmong and broke into the manager's back office, allegedly stealing a bank deposit bag containing cash. He reentered the establishment several more times that morning and was seen driving a blue Nissan Sentra.

The owner of the game room noticed the deposit bag was missing when she arrived at the bank at around 9am that same morning. She then reviewed the game room's surveillance footage, saw the defendant entering her locked office, and then called the Guam Police Department.

That evening, the owner observed a male individual enter the establishment and identified Cruz as the same person from the video footage. GPD Police Officers were called to the location to arrest Cruz. They noted a blue Nissan Sentra in the parking lot.

"The community is fighting back against individuals who are illegally entering their homes and businesses. With each conviction, our island becomes a safer place," said Assistant Attorney General Nicole Driscoll.
