Three Sentencing Hearings Today; Jail Time Imposed for Cox, Isaac, and Cruz, Respectively

March 07, 2019, Tamuning, Guam-Jeremy Dean Isaac, Afio Cox, and Gregorio Cruz were all sentenced today in their respective cases.

Jeremy Dean Isaac was sentenced to five years' incarceration with all but one year suspended today by Judge Bordallo after being convicted of Burglary as a Second-Degree Felony and Theft of Property as a Second Degree Felony back in July 2018.

Isaac broke a window to enter a home and left with watches, guitars and a number of other items. Isaac also caused much damage to the interior of the home. The Guam Police Department obtained fingerprints from the Yigo residence, confirming it was Isaac.

Afio Cox was sentenced to 7 years behind bars at the Department of Corrections (DOC) after he was sentenced today.

He was found guilty of Vehicular Homicide While Intoxicated as a Second Degree Felony, Vehicular Homicide as a Second Degree Felony, Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol With Injuries as a Third Degree Felony, Driving While Under the Influence of Alcohol as a Misdemeanor, and Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol (BAC) as a Misdemeanor.

Gregorio Blas Cruz was resentenced today in Judge Perez's courtroom today to 5 years' imprisonment, to run concurrent with a 70-month sentence imposed in a separate District Court case.

He was charged and convicted of Possession of a Controlled Substance with Intent to Deliver as a First Degree Felony and Possession of a Controlled Substance as a Third Degree Felony.

Cruz was driving a black mustang when Guam Police Departments officers effectuated a stop and found methamphetamine, paraphernalia and several thousand dollars in the car.

"We are pleased with the court-imposed sentences in these cases. It brings a successful conclusion to each of them. These are examples of good team effort by the Guam Police Department and the Prosecution Division," said Chief Prosecutor Basil O'Mallan.
