San Nicholas Found Guilty On All Seventeen Counts

Late this afternoon, a Guam Superior Court jury found Alvin San Nicholas guilty on fifteen counts of first degree criminal sexual conduct, one count of second degree criminal sexual conduct and one count misdemeanor child abuse.

San Nicholas repeatedly raped a young girl in 2009 and 2010 and on one occasion forced her to smoke methamphetamine out of a bong while her mother was off-island for military deployment.

“What makes this case especially egregious is the fact that the defendant took advantage of the victim while her mother was away serving our country and our island. Our sentencing recommendation will attempt to keep the defendant locked up behind bars for a long, long time,” said Attorney General Rapadas.

“While many people from many agencies worked very hard to secure justice in this case, all the credit belongs to the young woman who stood up to her abuser; all the credit belongs to her,” said Assistant Attorney General Brian Gallagher. “I’d like to thank the Jury for their thoughtful deliberations and Guam Police Department, Healing Hearts, and my colleagues from the Attorney General’s Office including the investigators, attorneys, support staff and the Victim Witness Ayuda Service (VWAS) members for all the hard work they put into this case.”
